[*14] Bakunin proffers an interesting set of rules of order that those who want to "come into our camp" must "promise" to uphold. (1) "To subordinate . . . personal . . family . . . as well as political and religious bias . . . to the highest interest of the association." (2) "Never . . . to compromise with the bourgeoisie." (3) "Never to attempt to secure a position above your fellow workers . . ." and (4) "To remain . . . loyal to this principle of the solidarity of labour" (131).

I'm not sure why I wanted to include these here. They are just interesting to me, pretty plain-speaking and level-headed, almost bureaucratic-sounding, for an anarchist!
